**ADDRESS BY PROF IMASIKU A NYAMBE, VICE CHANCELLOR AT THE 34TH GRADUATION CEREMONY OF THE
COPPERBELT UNIVERSITY**

THEME: "NURTURING INNOVATION AND ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE"
THURSDAY 23rd & 24th APRIL, 2026

The Guest of Honour, Ladies and Gentlemen, I whole heartedly welcome you all to the Copperbelt University's 34th graduation ceremony. The theme of this graduation is "**Nurturing Innovation and Academic Excellence**". It speaks to our capacity to innovate, pursue excellence, and apply these qualities to solve problems and address developmental challenges facing our country, region, and the world. This is as espoused in CBU 2025 – 2029 Strategic Plan. Let me stress that the Copperbelt University is transforming into a research-intensive university, with postgraduate education at the centre of this transformation. In today's rapidly evolving world, innovation has become a critical factor in the success and competitiveness of higher education institutions. Fostering an ecosystem that promotes innovation is essential to meet the demands of the knowledge economy, drive economic growth, and address complex societal challenges.

Guest of Honour Sir, Nurturing innovation in academia requires creating an environment that supports the development of game-changing ideas and sustained collaborations. This calls for a comprehensive review and transformation of postgraduate education at the Copperbelt University. We must reform policies, strategies, guidelines, and procedures governing postgraduate studies. This is the level where serious research and innovation thrive. For example, the yahoo email platform in USA originated from postgraduate research. At this stage, high-impact publications are strongly encouraged. Indeed, at CBU, candidates cannot graduate with a PhD without publishing at least three papers in reputable journals. To further stimulate research output and dissemination, CBU has introduced and is strengthening its own scholarly journals, including (i) the Journal of Engineering, Infrastructure, Natural and Environmental Sciences (JEINES), (ii) Medical and Bio-medical Journal (MBJ), (iii) Journal of Business, Economics, Law and Social Sciences (JBELS) and the (iv) Journal of Peace and Conflict Research (JPCR). These platforms provide accessible avenues for our faculty and students to publish high-quality, context-relevant research. These form the best training journals for our Postgraduate Students (Masters and PhDs) and are open to all the universities and Zambian public. Encourage all to publish in them.

Guest of Honour Sir, to nurture innovation from an early stage, we must create environments that provide opportunities for young innovators to connect, build relationships and sustain them over time. This is where our Mukuba University Innovation Pod (UNIPOD) plays a major role. It encourages both postgraduate and undergraduate students to develop and test their research and innovation ideas. For those who may not know it; Mukuba UNIPOD is Zambia's premier hub for cutting-edge research, innovation and creativity. It brings together academic excellence and state-of-the-art technology to transform bold ideas into ground breaking realities. At the Mukuba UNIPOD, we are actively forging collaborations with industry, businesses, startups, and community organizations. These partnerships are crucial in the innovation ecosystem; they bring real-world challenges, resources, and expertise, facilitating the transfer of knowledge, technology, and funding. The Mukuba UNIPOD is open to all Zambians. To strengthen this further, we are prioritising structured mentorship programmes, seed funding for student-led startups, intellectual property protection support, and regular innovation challenges and hackathons linked to national development priorities such as mining, agriculture, health, and climate resilience.

Guest of Honour Sir, our challenge as university management and staff is to serve as enablers and provide strong incentives for innovation and academic excellence. Strengthening postgraduate studies at CBU will enable us to produce researchers and innovators committed to cutting-edge research and the intergradation of innovative pedagogies into teaching at all levels. Universities that undertake robust research are also excellent educators. At CBU, academic excellence is an aspirational goal. We aim to enhance learning experiences that prepare students for success in their professional, entrepreneurial and personal lives. We therefore, seek partnerships to foster a practical and market-oriented approach to innovation. We make an

earnest appeal and extend an open invitation to industry and civil society to collaborate with the university in solving real-world problems.

Ladies and Gentlemen, the Mukuba UNIPOD, is a small and we need to do more and call on Private Sector to come in and set-up more such as the ProWings's of South Africa proposal for CBU Drones Centre of Excellence and Czech Mine Waters of the Copperbelt Project. As a university, we face several challenges, including overcrowded lecture rooms, insufficient staff office space, lack of new structures, limited specialized labs, inadequate health facilities for staff and students (especially for clinical students), insufficient recreational and sports facilities, lack of a modern student centre, insufficient hostel accommodation, and poor roads and landscaping. These pressures arise because the current infrastructure was originally designed for the Zambia Institute of Technology (ZIT), which catered for only 600 students in the late 1970s instead of 25,000 students of today utilizing literally the same infrastructure. In response, we developed the CBU Challenge, a flagship initiative aimed at collective investment responsibility among government, industry, alumni, individuals and business partners. The target is to raise K420 million for building and renovating critical infrastructure, including lecture theatres, a Level 2 hospital, laboratories, and recreation facilities. The CBU challenge follows a self-help and partnership approach to mobilize and augment resources. Today, the Zambia National Service is helping to build a 1000-seater lecture theatre and install a 300,000-litre water tank to support three water boreholes for improved water and sanitation at CBU. We invite the active participation of all alumni including all those graduating today, and stakeholders in this important resource mobilization drive.

Guest of Honour Sir, today's graduation is also a special one because the university is conferring **honorary doctorate awards to 4 deserving Zambians who have demonstrated exemplary service to humanity and outstanding achievements**. The university Senate unanimously approved their nominations for their high personal integrity, concern for the public good, leadership, and public service. Their remarkable accomplishments make us proud today and CBU is honored to recognize them. The citations will later detail their contributions to Mother Zambia.

Graduation statistics

Guest of Honour Sir, Ladies and Gentlemen, it is now time to turn to our graduands. Join me in warmly congratulating them on this well-deserved achievement. It did not come by chance- they worked diligently (despite occasional appeals to the Vice Chancellor). The Copperbelt University upholds high standards of quality and no one receives a qualification on a silver platter. On the academic part, CBU currently has 26,072 students of which 210 are International Students. Of these, 565 are Postgraduate Students and 25,506 Undergraduate Students. Today, I warmly congratulate our graduands for staying focused and meeting all requirements. I present a total of 2,433 graduands – a record number. Of these, Six (6) will graduate with PhDs, 508 with Masters degrees and 1,919 with Bachelor's degrees and diplomas. We are proud to be very close to achieving gender parity; 50.6 % of the graduands are female and 49.4% are male.

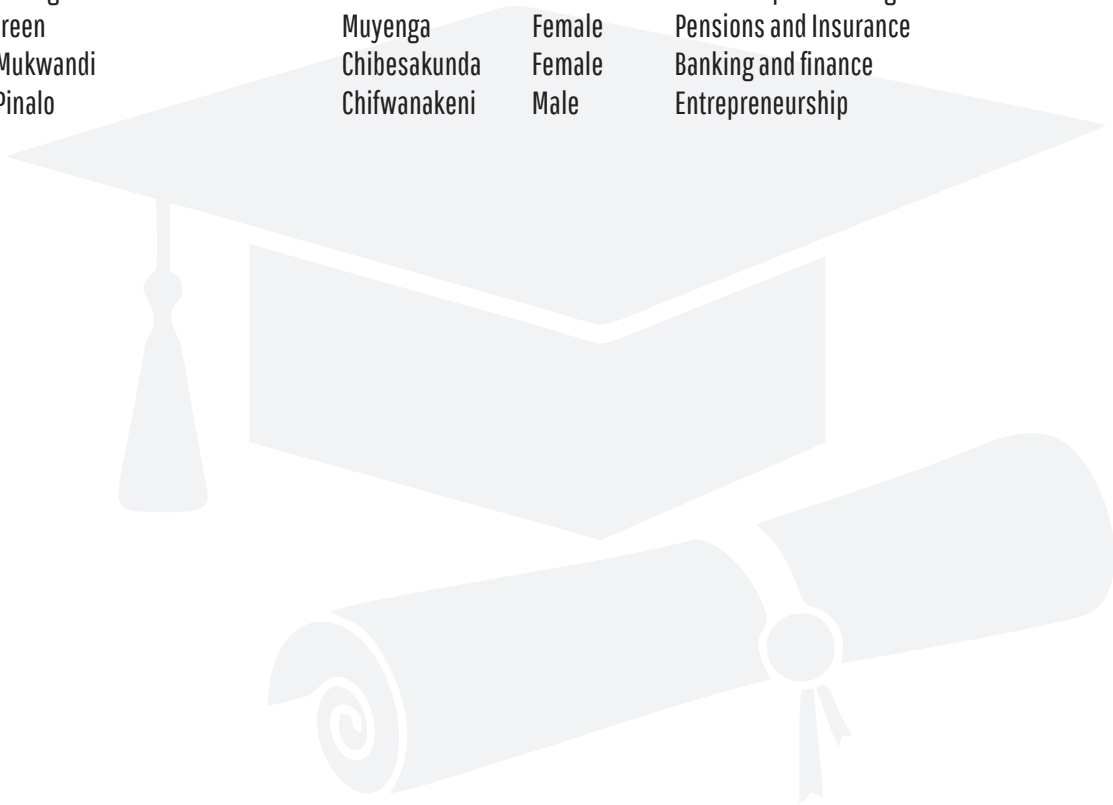

Bernadette Kaulungombe (MBA, BBA)

THESIS TITLE: The influence of leadership styles on quality of work life and internal customer satisfaction in Universities in Zambia

Bernadette Kaulung'ombe holds a Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) and Master of Business Administration (MBA) from the Copperbelt University. In 2025, Bernadette completed her PhD by research at the Copperbelt University, School of Business, under the sponsorship of Northrise University. Her research focused on how leadership styles influence the quality of work life (QWL) and internal customer satisfaction (ICS) among academic staff in private and public universities in Zambia. She was supervised by Prof Evaristo Nsenduluka (Lead Supervisor) and Dr Matthew K Banda (Co-Supervisor) from the School of Business at the Copperbelt University. The study validates the appropriateness of the Service Profit Chain model by demonstrating that highly engaged and satisfied employees serve customers better, in turn increasing customer loyalty and financial performance in the higher education sector. Some of the findings of the research were published as two journal articles, resulting in the award of the PhD in Business.

Thesis Abstract

This quantitative study pioneered the exploration of the role of quality of work life (QWL) in the relationship between leadership styles and internal customer satisfaction (ICS) among academic staff in universities in Zambia. Specifically, the study sought to determine the relationship between leadership styles and QWL; to examine the influence of QWL on ICS; to investigate the role of QWL in the relationship between leadership styles and ICS; and to compare ICS and its antecedents in Public and Private universities in Zambia. Conceptualisation was underpinned by the Service Profit Chain Theory suggesting that highly engaged and satisfied employees serve customers better, in turn increasing customer loyalty and financial performance. Guided by a positivist paradigm, the study employed a cross-sectional survey of 404 academic staff from private and public universities using stratified sampling. Utilising SPSS and Smart PLS-SEM for descriptive statistics and structural equation modelling, the results revealed that the indirect effects of transactional leadership ($\beta = 0.134, t = 3.785, p < 0.001$), transformational leadership ($\beta = 0.140, t = 3.351, p < 0.001$) and democratic leadership ($\beta = 0.260, t = 8.195, p < 0.001$) on ICS were significant while autocratic leadership ($\beta = 0.026, t = 1.079, p = 0.280$) and laissez-faire leadership ($\beta = -0.049, t = 1.539, p = 0.124$) were largely insignificant. These results demonstrate the significant effect of the work environment on employee outcomes and the crucial role that leaders play in creating such a healthy work environment through their chosen leadership approaches. Overall, this research contributes valuable insights into the interplay of leadership, quality of work life, and internal customer satisfaction and offers practical implications for managers and practitioners in the higher education sector. In particular, the study recommends that managers pay attention to the types of leadership styles that enhance the quality of work life. Lastly, policymakers may encourage policies that elevate the quality of work life in both private and public universities. To enhance the generalisability of conclusions, future studies may utilise empirical data from other sectors of the economy or countries.



Anthony Sinyangwe (MBA, BBA)

THESIS TITLE: The institutional environment and its effects on the performance of small-scale mining enterprises: Evidence from Zambia

Anthony Sinyangwe holds a Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) and Master of Business Administration (MBA) from the Copperbelt University. In 2025, Anthony completed his PhD by research at the Copperbelt University, School of Business, under the auspices of the World Bank ACE-II CBU Africa Centre of Excellence for Sustainable Mining (CBU-ACESM) Scholarship. His research focused on how the institutional environment influences the performance of artisanal and small-scale mining enterprises in Zambia. He was supervised by Prof Bruce Mwiya (Lead Supervisor) and Prof John Lungu (Co-Supervisor) from the School of Business at the Copperbelt University. The study validates the appropriateness of using institutional theory to demonstrate how to shape regulatory, cognitive and normative institutional environments to positively affect the performance of artisanal and small-scale mining enterprises in emerging economies. Some of the findings of the research were published as two journal articles, resulting in the award of the PhD in Business.

Thesis Abstract

This study investigates the impact of the institutional environment on the performance of Small-Scale Mining Enterprises (SSMEs) in Zambia, employing institutional theory as its theoretical foundation. The institutional environment was assessed across three dimensions: regulatory and supportive institutions, cognitive institutions, and normative institutions. A concurrent triangulation design was used to collect data from 408 purposively selected SSMEs through both qualitative and quantitative methods, analysed via SMART PLS 4 and SPSS 26 while 28 respondents participated in focused group discussions and key informative interviews that resulted in qualitative data output analysed using thematic analysis. Findings reveal that all three institutional dimensions significantly influence SSME performance. Favourable regulatory frameworks, accessible knowledge resources, and supportive socio-cultural norms correlate positively with improved enterprise outcomes. Contrary to expectations, the legal status of SSMEs, whether formal or informal did not significantly moderate this relationship. The study introduces a novel, multi-level integrative model that holistically evaluates institutional influences on SSMEs, advancing empirical and theoretical understanding in a developing country context. Key contributions include validating the tri-dimensional institutional framework in the Zambian SSME context, highlighting the role of individual entrepreneurial traits in navigating institutional landscapes, and offering a policy-relevant model to support formalisation and growth of the sector. The study underscores the importance of institutional coherence and tailored support mechanisms to enhance the viability and sustainability of small-scale mining enterprises.



Derrick Kalanga (MA, Bth)

THESIS TITLE: The Role of the Church in National Reconciliation: A Case of the United Church of Zambia, 1991–2011

Rev. Derrick Kalanga holds a Master of Arts Degree in Ecumenical Theology from the University of Bonn, Germany, and a Bachelor of Theology from the University of the Western Cape, South Africa. His academic formation also includes international ecumenical training at the Bossey Ecumenical Institute of the World Council of Churches in Geneva, Switzerland, and advanced theological studies at St. Stephen's College in Alberta, Canada.

Rev. Kalanga pursued his doctoral studies in the Dag Hammarskjöld Institute for Peace and Conflict Studies and was sponsored by the Methodist Church of Scotland. He was supervised by Dr. Gosnell L. Yorke as Main Supervisor and Dr. Rosemary Chilufya as Co-Supervisor. He investigated the nexus between faith, reconciliation, and national transformation. His study offers a compelling analysis of how the United Church of Zambia (UCZ), in spite of being vested with authority by its own Constitution (2014 and revised 2024), has consistently shown a disinclination to engage independently with the processes of national healing, mediation, and democratic dialogue during some critical conflict-generating moments in Zambia's political history. His study sheds significant light on the prophetic and reconciling role of the Church in society, demonstrating how faith communities can and should serve as agents of peacebuilding, ethical leadership, and social cohesion in times of political tension and national uncertainty. Part of the study's findings were published as two journal articles in internationally recognized journals, leading to the award of the Doctor of Philosophy in Peace and Conflict Studies.

Thesis Abstract

The thesis critically examines the role of the United Church of Zambia (UCZ) in national reconciliation processes between 1991 and 2011, focusing on its constitutional mandate to engage in matters of public interest. Anchored in liberal peace theory and employing a qualitative methodology, the study investigates the UCZ's engagement in four major political conflicts: the Kaunda–Chiluba transition (1991–2000), Chiluba's third-term bid (2000–2001), the Mung'omba Constitution Review Commission (2003–2011), and the Barotseland Agreement-related unrest (2010–2011). Findings reveal that while the UCZ possessed institutional authority to mediate national conflicts, its interventions were marked by strategic ambiguity, reactive engagement, and limited prophetic independence. The church's proximity to political power, hierarchical rigidity, and selective collaboration with ecumenical bodies such as the Christian Council of Zambia undermined its credibility and effectiveness. Notably, its failure to condemn state violence during the Barotseland shootings exemplified a broader pattern of institutional silence. The thesis argues that the UCZ's reconciliation efforts were largely symbolic, constrained by structural inertia and political caution. Theoretically, it contributes to liberal peace



Mwiya Winnifred Songolo (Dip, BEng, MEng.Sc)

THESIS TITLE: Optimisation of mineral royalty aligned with cutoff grade for mining Zambian copper orebodies

Mwiya Winnifred Songolo's research advances sustainable mining policy and mineral economics in Zambia. His research work addressed longstanding instability in the Zambian mineral royalty regime, proposing a balanced framework that aligns investor returns with national benefit. His research work has also demonstrated that mineral royalty must be linked to cut-off grade, a key determinant of mine viability and long-term returns. Using net present value (NPV) modelling, the scholar quantifies the opportunity costs of royalties and developed a capacity constraint model for optimal fiscal design. When applied to Zambian copper mines, his findings show that consistent model-based royalty systems outperform subjective policy adjustments. Mwiya's research proposes both mine-specific agreements and a uniform optimal royalty rate of 7.4% for the Zambian mining sector. Part of the research findings have been published in internationally recognised journals, leading to the award of the Doctor of Philosophy in Sustainable Mining.

Thesis Abstract

Zambia's mining industry has been subjected to mineral royalty fiscal regime changes almost every 2.5 years, making the sector increasingly unsustainable. These changes have been pursued to achieve a balanced return on investment (ROI) and equitable benefits for citizens. Since the cut-off grade defines ore reserves and determines ROI over the life of a mine, the mineral royalty payable is directly linked to ore reserves through revenue. The main objective of this research was to optimise the mineral royalty, aligned with cut-off grades, for mining Zambian copper orebodies to balance benefits to the investor and the government. The study employed a net present value (NPV) approach and a cut-off grade model to quantify the opportunity cost associated with mineral royalties, thereby establishing the relationship between cut-off grade and mineral royalty. Based on this relationship, a mineral royalty capacity constraint model (MRCCM), informed by the discount rate, the Bank of Zambia weighted lending base rate, the net present value, and the discounted mineral royalty payable, was developed to optimise the Ad valorem mineral royalty. Using data from large-scale Zambian copper mines, the study determined acceptable mineral royalty rates of 8%, 7%, 6.4%, 8.1%, 6.2%, and 8.8%, corresponding to cut-off grades of 0.24% Cu, 0.15% Cu, 0.22% Cu, 2.31% Cu, 2.10% Cu, and 2.09% Cu, for Barrick Lumwana, FQM Trident, Kansanshi, MCM's Nkana, MCM's Mufulira, and the consolidated copper orebodies of MCM's Nkana and Mufulira, respectively. Statistical analysis yielded a mean royalty of 7.4% with a standard deviation of 4.5%, reflecting the inherent characteristics of ore deposits and financial variability across the sector. The lower and upper limits of the distribution were 2.9% and 11.9%, respectively, representing the central tendency of the Zambian mining industry. The study shows that mineral royalties can be optimised using the developed MRCCM, which provides a framework for balancing the interests of investors and mineral resource owners.

Two policy options are recommended: (i) Zambia should revert to signing mine development agreements that reflect the specific acceptable mineral royalties, or (ii) implement a uniform optimal mineral royalty of 7.4% across all copper mining operations. This research also presents the Songolo model web application as a practical tool for government and investors to optimise



Lubinda Nabiwa (MSc Physics with Ed, BSc Physics with Ed)

THESIS TITLE: A comprehensive analysis of respirable crystalline silica exposure at a Zambian Copper Mine

Lubinda Nabiwa's study addressed the critical occupational health hazard of respirable dust (RD) and respirable crystalline silica (RCS) exposure in copper mines, with a specific focus on Zambia. The study was driven by the green energy transition which is expected to triple Zambia's copper production by 2031, potentially increasing incidents of overexposure. The research design involved a cross-sectional study at the Zambian mine. Personal exposure monitoring involved 114 samples which were collected through the National Institute of Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH), with analysis performed at an internationally accredited lab. The study also involved calibrating an OPC against the SGS method to enable in-time and post-shift exposure assessment.

Key results from the study indicate that an average personal RCS exposure exceeded health-based limits. While there was an improvement from 2008, 32.4% of RCS samples still exceeded the OSHA PEL. The study concludes by indicating that monitoring RD alone is insufficient and that mandatory, routine RCS monitoring is essential. Without these proactive measures, miners in Zambia's expanding copper industry remain at high risk of developing debilitating occupational lung diseases like silicosis. Guided by Dr Simfukwe as the primary supervisor and Prof Linde of North-West University as the Co-supervisor, part of his research was published as journal articles in internationally recognised journals, leading to his award for the Doctor of Philosophy in Physics.

Thesis Abstract

This study addresses the critical occupational health hazard of respirable dust (RD) and respirable crystalline silica (RCS) exposure in copper mines, with a specific focus on Zambia. The context is urgent, as global demand for copper, driven by the green energy transition, is expected to triple Zambia's copper production by 2031, potentially increasing incidents of overexposure. This is particularly concerning for a specific Zambian mine, which historically had the highest number of pneumoconiosis cases in the country and where, in 2008, 56% of RCS samples exceeded the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) permissible exposure limit. The methods involved a systematic literature review of global copper mine exposures and a cross-sectional study at the Zambian mine. Personal exposure monitoring (114 samples) was conducted using National Institute of Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) methods, with analysis performed at an internationally accredited lab. The study also involved calibrating an OPC against the SGS method to enable in-time and post-shift exposure assessment.

Key results from the global review found that while average RD exposure was often within limits, maximum concentrations frequently exceeded them. More alarmingly, average personal RCS exposure exceeded health-based limits like the American Conference of Governmental Industrial Hygienists – Threshold Limit Value (ACGIH – TLV) in all mining sites reviewed. In the Zambian mine study, while there was an improvement from 2008, 32.4% of RCS samples still exceeded the OSHA PEL, and 11.7% exceeded the Republic of South Africa's (RSA) Occupational Exposure Limit (OEL) of 0.1 mg/m³. Statistical analysis revealed that 61% of activity areas had miners overexposed to RCS. The OPC demonstrated a strong correlation with the SGS method, proving its viability. Data also revealed problematic peak exposures and identified that mine sections with conveyor belts generated larger particles, which contribute more to the mass concentration.

The study concludes with several critical recommendations indicating that Zambia should adopt occupational exposure limits from comparable regions such as the RSA. The use of the OPC should be implemented to complement the SGS method, providing valuable in-time data on engineering controls, peak exposures, and particle size. Continuous training for miners on adhering to safety guidelines and training more certified occupational hygienists is vital. Zambia must develop and adopt formal standards for sampling and exposure data analysis.

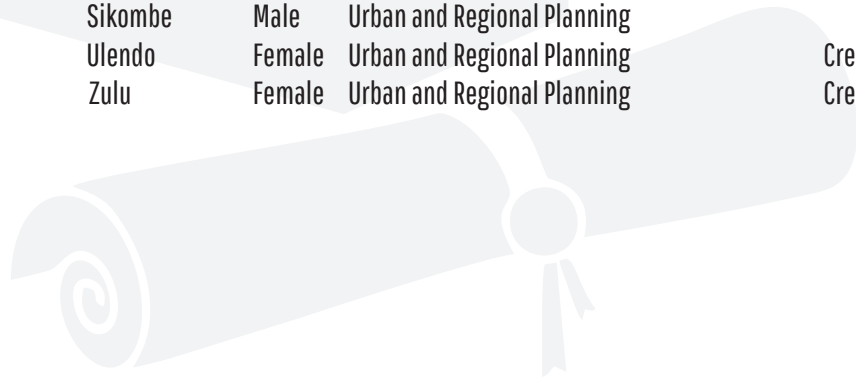

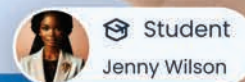
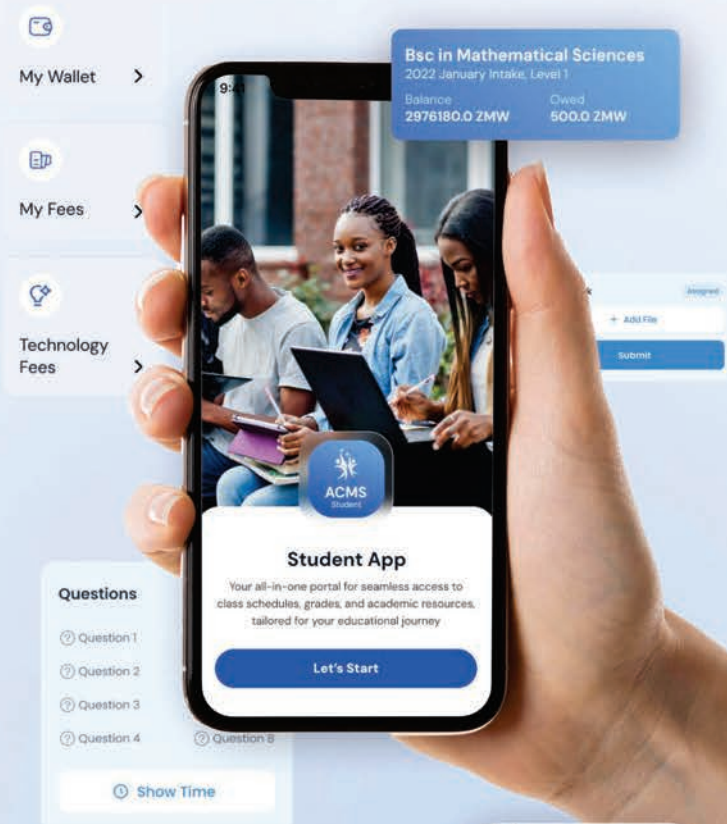

I have been honest, hardworking and humble in the process of my learning. I pledge to continue in this attitude in my life and practice.

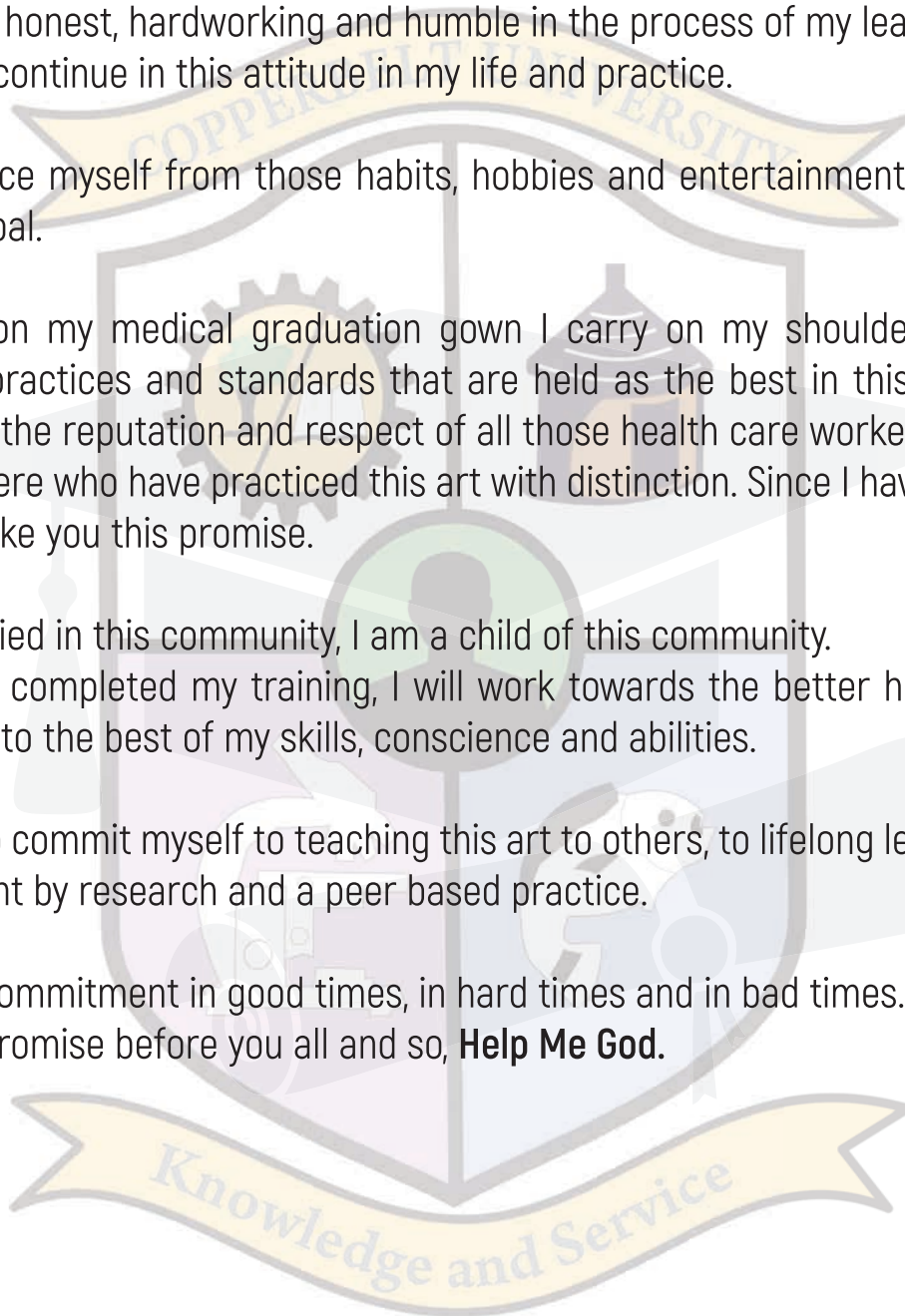
I will distance myself from those habits, hobbies and entertainments that deter from this goal.

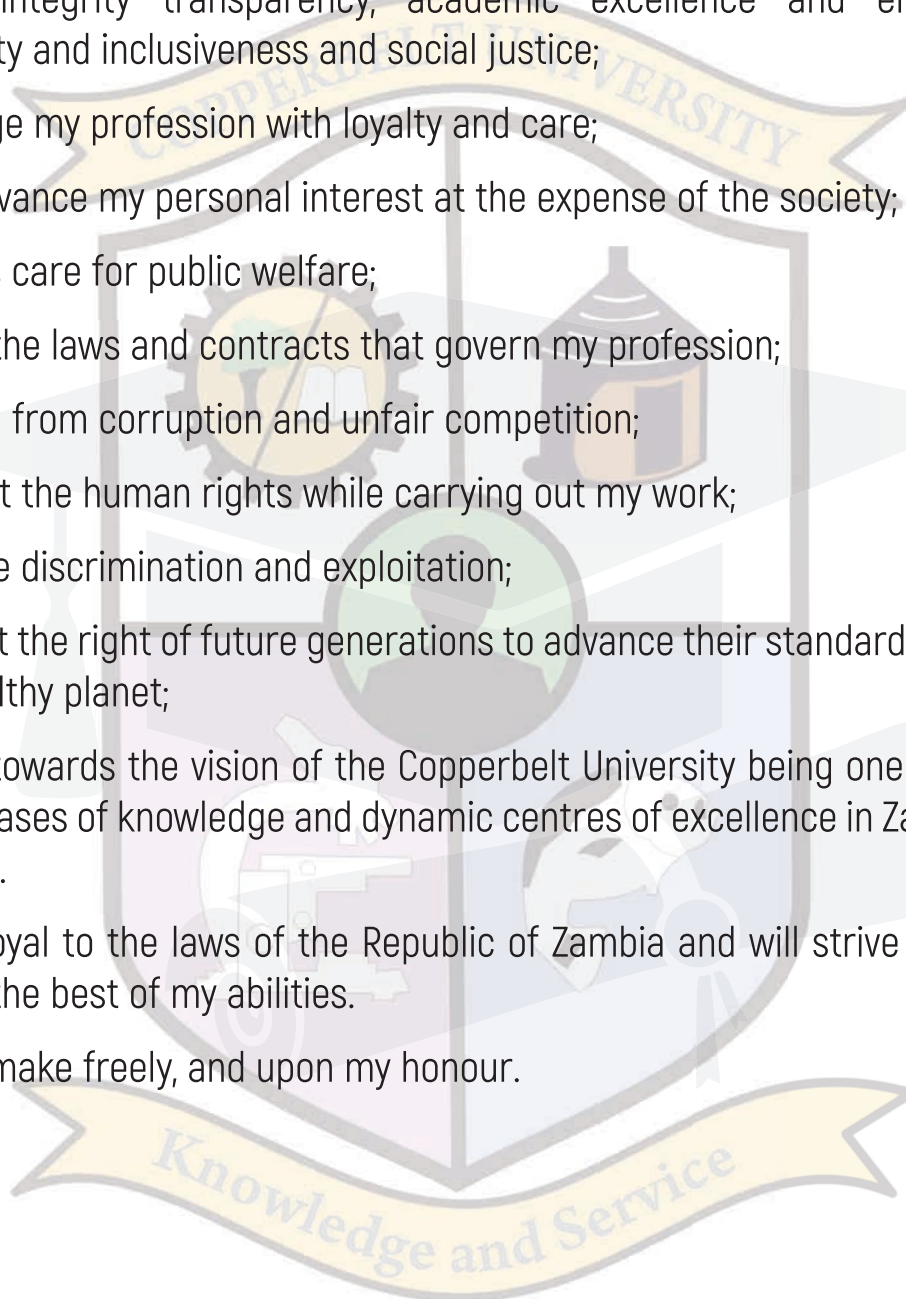

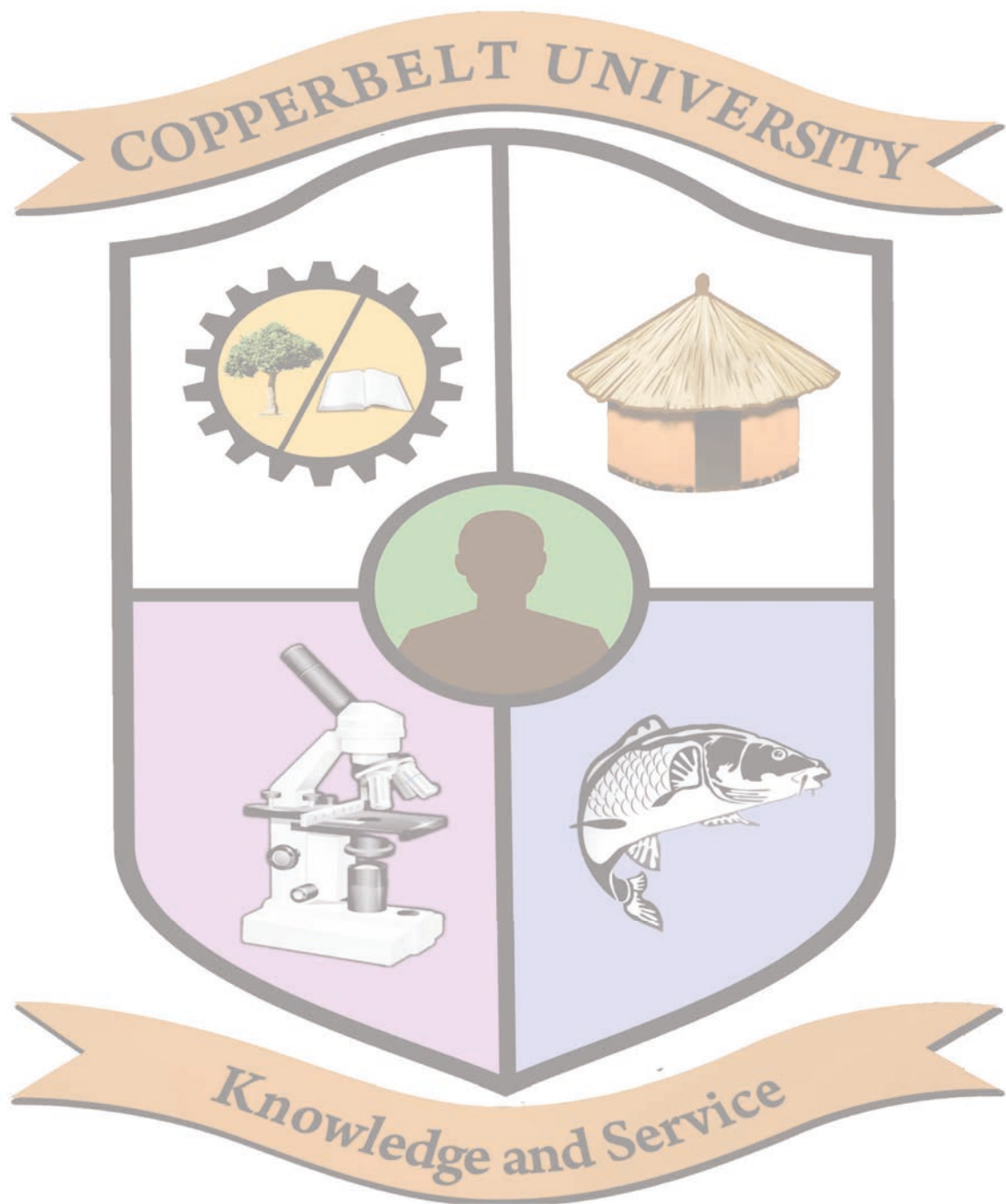
